## The Rector writes....

My dear Parishioners

Over these 'dark days before Christmas', many morning commuters to work are leaving home in darkness and at the end of their working day are returning in darkness. We feel a significant drop in the temperatures and the leaves are falling at a rate which we find it hard to keep up with. In the gloom

and darkness of winter many people feel a heaviness in their spirit and that sometimes may lead to changes in mood and even feelings of depression. The News is full of concern about rising numbers in cases of COVID-19 and how overstretched many hospitals are at the present time. As I write the devastating announcement has been made of the discovery of a new variant of the virus in South Africa and its neighbouring countries which very speedily reached our 'doorstep' in Belgium, with cases now reported in the United Kingdom. There continues to be a high level of uncertainty about restrictions and various measures that health experts are recommending in order to keep people safe. There are others involved in business who want to see restrictions lifted further in order to allow people to go out and spend and boost the economy after the challenges of the past 20 months.

Here in Annahilt and Magherahamlet, we are trying to offer services that mean something to our parishioners at this time of year. Last month, for the first time we had a Service of Lessons and Carols to mark the beginning of Advent. The focus was on the prophets and was well received by all who participated. As our young people celebrate the birth of the Christ child at the Christingle service in both our Churches (10.00 in Annahilt and 12.00 in Magherahamlet) it is very appropriate that both Services will include a Baptism.

On the Sunday before Christmas, 19 December, there will be the traditional Service of Nine Lessons and Carols (11.30 am in Magherahamlet and 3.00 pm in Annahilt).

In Annahilt, we will also be sharing the First Communion of Christmas with the Minister & Congregation of Legacurry Presbyterian Church at **11.15pm** on Christmas Eve and enjoying a Christmas Morning Family celebration at 10.00 am. In Magherahamlet on Christmas Day there will be a celebration of the Holy Communion at **11.30** am. As St Stephen's Day falls on a Sunday this year, there will be Services in both Churches (**10.00am** in Annahilt and **11.30am** in Magherahamlet). We look forward to joining our friends in Legacurry for the Watchnight Service on New Year's Eve at **6.30 pm**.

It goes without saying that we can make the best possible plans but in current

circumstances and without warning, the goalposts can suddenly shift.

One of the tremendous encouragements of this season for people of faith is that Jesus will enter our world afresh during this season of Advent and Christmas. If we engage with him and make space in our hearts to receive Him, He wants to find a home with us wherever we are. That's a beautiful thing to connect into but it's perhaps not as straightforward as it appears.

There seems to be a myriad of things that will distract us away. We become so busy at this time of year buying presents, decorating the house, writing Christmas cards and preparing food for those family members and friends we hope can join us around our table. We also feel acutely the pain of remembering those who are no longer physically with us and the weight of our burdens seems heavier to carry in this season.

I ask you to continue to book in to attend our Services especially those which are particularly popular over this season. Of course, I recognise that with the current restrictions and concerns, not everyone will manage to come in person. That is why I encourage those who can, to avail of the technology that allows services to be recorded and be heard on our parish website or on CD. If you cannot come on the day, these give you the opportunity to worship on a day and time that works best for you. My little word of advice is to try to make that time and set it aside it for that spiritual purpose. Let us engage as fully as we can at the time we have allocated or designated to our spiritual preparations for this season. If you need help with booking please speak to one of our Churchwardens.

I always find it exciting to think about the light breaking into the darkness. I rejoice in the birth of our Saviour who has come to bring new life and hope and meaning to all who search for those things in this life. If there's anyone or anything you would like us to pray for please let me know and we would be glad to do that.

I wish you all a blessed Advent and peaceful Christmas. Thank you for all you have done throughout this past year to support the Church, as well as phoning and staying in touch with people and taking an interest in God's work locally and in other parts of the world.

I wish you all an enriching and fulfilling Advent, a peaceful and blessed Christmas and a hopeful New Year.

#### The season of Advent

'Advent' means 'coming' and marks the four weeks leading up to the celebration of the Nativity and the coming of Christ. It is traditionally a season of penance and preparation before Christmas. The official Church liturgical colour is purple, a symbol of penitence. Weddings used to be forbidden during this season, as they once were during Lent.

Tradition has given its own flavour to each of the Advent Sundays. The Sunday next before Advent was known as 'Stir up



Sunday', so named because it was the day for 'stirring up' Christmas puddings. The second Sunday was known as Bible Sunday when our focus was on the reading, preaching and distribution of God's Word as revealed in the books of the Bible. The third Sunday is the 'Gaudete' Sunday from the Latin word for 'rejoice'. On that day everyone took a break from the penitential theme. A rose coloured candle is lit on this Sunday.

In our Churches an Advent wreath is often among the decorations made with evergreen branches such as holly, yew or pine. The four Advent candles are fixed into the wreath along with a white candle which represents the Light of Christ coming into the world at Christmas.

Advent calendars are still popular today, usually a card with twenty-four small doors, one to be opened each day from the first day of December until Christmas Eve. Each door conceals a picture, which originally had biblical themes. Every morning children open one door to see a pretty picture or find a chocolate inside. This popular tradition arose in Germany in the late 1800s and soon spread throughout Europe and North America.

#### Gifts at Christmas

On Christmas Day, at the 10.00 am Family Service in Annahilt and at Parish Communion at 11.30 am in Magherahamlet, the young people attending are asked to bring with them a present which they have been given for Christmas. There will be an opportunity during the service to show their gift to the congregation and to say a prayer of thanksgiving.

## **Holy Communion in Church**

There will be three celebrations of the Holy Communion in the Group of Parishes over the Christmas period.



Unfortunately, it is not practical to have an early Communion Service in Annahilt on Christmas Day this year. Instead, there

will be a SAID Communion Service on the Sunday **BEFORE** Christmas, 19 December, at the later time of **9.30 am.** This may be of particular interest to those who usually attended the early celebration prior to its suspension at the beginning of the Pandemic. In present circumstances it may also suit those who prefer a shorter and 'quieter' act of worship.

On Christmas Eve, 24 December at **11.15 pm** the First Communion of Christmas will be shared with the Minister and Congregation of Legacurry Presbyterian Church.

On Christmas Day, 25 December at the earlier time of **11.30 am** the Parish Communion of Christmas Day will be celebrated in Magherahamlet Parish Church.

On St Stephen's Day, 26 December at 10.00 am there will be Parish Communion in Annahilt at 10.00 am

#### Private Communion at Christmas

Any parishioners who are ill or housebound or who in present circumstances are not in a position to attend church and would like Holy Communion in their own home before Christmas should contact the Rector who will only be too pleased to make the arrangements. Tel 028 9263 8218.

#### **Christmas Carol Services**

In present circumstances it has been necessary to maintain the somewhat different arrangements which were made last year for our traditional Carol Services in both Parishes.

In Annahilt, on account of the necessity of safe distancing it is not possible for either the Parish Choir or the Choir of Anahilt Primary School to participate as in past years. However, a congregational Service of Lessons and Carols will take place on Sunday 19 December at **3.00 pm** in the Church of the Ascension.

There will be **NO** service in Annahilt at 10.00 am

This year in Magherahamlet Parish, Spa Presbyterian and Magherahamlet Presbyterian, it has again been left to each Church to make its own arrangements.

A congregational Carol Service will be held in Magherahamlet Parish Church on Sunday **morning** 19 December at the earlier time of **11.30** am.

#### Christian Burial

'In Christ shall all be made alive'

Hilary will be remembered as a devoted daughter to her late parents, a dearly loved and loving wife to her late husband Michael and a wonderful mother to Jackie and Anthony. Jackie and Anthony became the people today because of what Hilary instilled in them and the way she helped them in so many ways. It is they and their families who will miss her most and we extend to them our deepest sympathy.

Hilary was an independent thinker, very determined and hardworking, with strong views on many subjects. She was always very kind and generous towards others. She had a great passion for horse racing, art, interiors, furniture and people.

Hilary lived in Annahilt for some 60 years and always loved the farm. She maintained a circle of close friends in the locality, particularly the Mackie and the Stronge families

Her memory and example will be enduring.

Robert Trimble, Laird's Road

Following a Service in the Church of the Ascension cremation took place at Roselawn Crematorium.

Robert was one of a family of four born to the late John & Charlotte Trimble and was brought up in Glarryford, Ballymena. He began his education at the local primary school and subsequently at Dalriada Grammar School at Ballymoney. Later, he graduated in Civil Engineering at the Queen's University of Belfast.

Following his graduation Robert was initially employed by Down County Council until he left for Nigeria in 1961. After a year and a half he returned home and met Trudy in 1963. They became engaged a year later and were married in St Mark's Church, Portadown in 1965 after which they lived in Holland until January 1966. They then moved to Canada, close to Montreal, where their son Paul was born. Some eight months after his birth the family returned to Northern Ireland, setting up home in Knock, Belfast. Sometime after their daughter Karen was born they moved again and went to South Africa, living at Pinetown near Durban where Robert worked for Durban County Council. They left South Africa in 1972 and went to Nigeria for another  $1\frac{1}{2}$  years before finally returning to Northern Ireland.

Robert resumed his career as a Highway Engineer and designed part of the ring road from Knock to Forestside. He retired in 1994. He and Trudy moved to their present surroundings on Laird's Road in 1999 where he designed the garden. They made this Parish Church their spiritual home and were regular attendees at worship. Robert was also a devoted reader of the Bible on a daily basis.

Over the years, Robert was a keen golfer and also enjoyed playing squash. He played weekly at both sports until his health declined. He won medals from Queen's University for discus throwing. He was also a skilled artist.

Robert's period of illness was an extended one, which he bore with dignity and grace.

We extend our deep and prayerful sympathy to Robert's wife Trudy, son Paul, daughter Karen, son-in-law Rob, grandsons Max and Joshua, sister Maureen, brother-in-law Jim and other family members in their great loss.

With the closure of direct services in the local area, five experienced Social Workers have set up a not-for-profit Community Interest Company called STARNI to continue providing support to children and families impacted by sexual abuse. STARNI is based in Millennium Court Arts Centre in Portadown. Our mission is to create a safe

and nurturing environment where children feel comfortable and safe enough to explore their thoughts and feelings.

As STARNI has only been running since the beginning of November, we are not currently working with many children as we would have been in previous years. We expect that by next Christmas we will be working with more children and would love to be able to give them Christmas gifts at that time.

This year, at the Christingle Services in both Annahilt and Magherahamlet we are asking whether you might consider donating art materials that we can use in children's sessions to help them express difficult emotions as we know that often it is too



difficult for children to talk about this. Some ideas include canvases, paint, craft items, clay, drawing paper, felt tips and glitter. Alternatively, if you would like to donate the money you might have otherwise spent on a Christmas gift, this would go directly to the running costs of STAR NI and would greatly assist us as we get up and running.

We are looking forward to meeting you when we attend the Christingle Services on **Sunday 12 December at 10.00 am in Annahilt and at 12.00 noon in Magherahamlet**. ## **Finance Matters – Magherahamlet**

If you are a UK taxpayer, you can boost the amount of every donation you make by giving through "Gift Aid". This is an Income Tax relief scheme created to help charities like our church get the most out of funds that they receive. Gift Aid enables the church to recover the base rate of tax on your donation. The scheme adds 25 pence on each £1.00 you give at no extra cost to you.

We would ask all taxpayers who give to parish funds to give through "Gift Aid". All that is required is the completion of a "Gift Aid Declaration" form. If you have recently stopped paying tax then any existing Gift Aid declaration needs to be cancelled.
