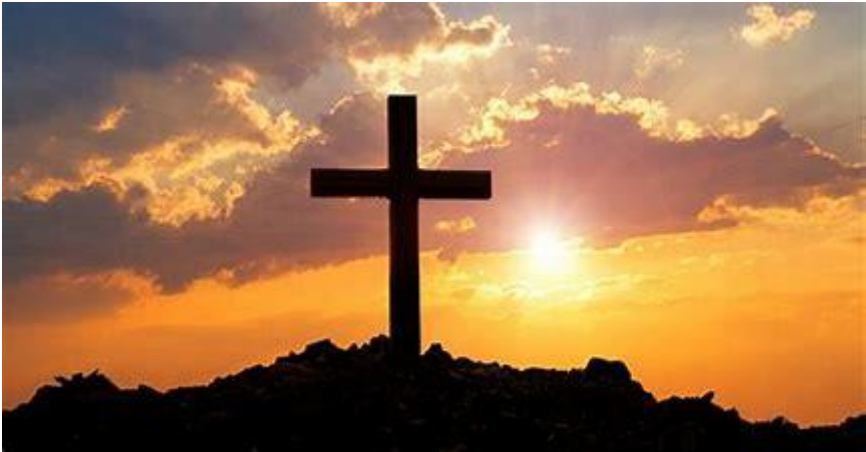

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The Rector writes....

My dear Parishioners

I wonder if you have ever been struck by how music can transport you to other places and times in your life?

Sometimes we hear a song on the radio or a hymn in church and it takes us back, perhaps, to our school days or holidays or memories of what we were doing when that song was first released and then played repeatedly on the radio for weeks and perhaps months afterwards.

I always think of the season of Lent as a journey. It's a journey that Christians are invited to take as they accompany Jesus to Jerusalem and eventually to the Cross. If we decide to try to live with Jesus at the centre of our lives, it involves taking Him into the good parts as well as some of the more challenging and difficult parts. Sometimes we are walking along on that journey and we feel fulfilled and content but at other times we seem to be assailed by doubts and questions. We feel angry and confused as unexpected circumstances seem to derail us without warning. We wonder why something has happened to us - an illness, a bereavement, a crushing disappointment. We find it hard to get the courage to put our shoes on again and go outside the door.

Notwithstanding existing circumstances, I want to encourage you to take a spiritual walk with Jesus through the season of Lent towards the Cross. Everyone is suffering at the present time to a greater or lesser extent because of the pandemic. Many of the liberties we normally take for granted are denied us. We cannot walk or travel as freely as we would wish. It is not possible to visit friends or family under the current restrictions and we are not able, at the time of writing, to attend our accustomed places of worship.

Does this mean that God has disappeared or is unable to break through into our lives? I do not believe so. Our task is to *keep* walking with him. It's to be faithful and honest and admit those times when we are struggling. It's about making ourselves available to hear from him whether through daily Bible readings or times of prayer. It's about availing of those opportunities available to us through the online services either from our own parish churches or from somewhere we have never been before. During this season how much space can you allow to say important things to you or to teach you things you need to learn and receive?

During Holy Week this year I myself will lead our devotional journey. From Monday 29 March to Maundy Thursday 1 April the daily Services will be on-line from 7.00 pm. On Good Friday evening, 2 April, DV we expect to return to Magherahamlet

Parish Church at 8.00 pm for the now familiar Tenebrae Service. On Easter Day, 4 April, we intend to have Services in both Annahilt and Magherahamlet to celebrate the joy of our Lord's Resurrection.

In the uncertainty of these times when so much is 'up in the air', do please endeavour to avail of this opportunity either on-line or in person to journey with Jesus through this Holy Season and be blessed by what you discover in your encounter with Him.

I wish you and yours a peaceful and blessed Easter.

Lent, Holy Week and Easter

Statement from the Church of Ireland Bishops in Northern Ireland in relation to Public Worship

Following the Northern Ireland Executive's decision to extend the current Covid-19 restrictions to Thursday 1 April 2021, representatives of the Churches met with Ministers from the Executive Office, the Minister of Health and the Chief Medical Officer. At that meeting the Chief Medical Officer stressed that it would make a significant difference and be of huge benefit to public health and safety, if churches were willing to continue, for the time being, not to gather in-person for services and other meetings.

In the light of the Executive's extension of the current restrictions, and on the basis of the continued and unequivocal public health message that people should continue to stay at home, we have agreed that all in-person Sunday gatherings for worship, along with all other in-person church gatherings, should remain voluntarily suspended for the time being in all Church of Ireland parishes in Northern Ireland until Thursday 1 April 2021 - with the exception of weddings, funerals, arrangements for recording and/or live-streaming, drive-in services and private prayer (as permitted by regulations).

We have also agreed to further assess the situation immediately after the next NI Executive review of current lockdown provisions on Thursday 18 March 2021, in the cautious anticipation that, from Friday 2 April (Good Friday) onwards, our parishioners in Northern Ireland could return to in-person gatherings for worship, with all necessary precautions and mitigations in place. This recognises importance of Easter, the significance of which was acknowledged by the Minister for Health and the Chief Medical Officer at their most recent meeting with Church representatives.

We welcome that a similar approach is also being taken by the Methodist Church, the Presbyterian Church and, in a slightly different form, by the Roman Catholic Church.

GOOD FRIDAY TENEBRAE SERVICE 8.00 pm

What is a Tenebrae Service? The word 'tenebrae' is Latin for shadows. The purpose of the Tenebrae service is to recreate the emotional aspects of the passion story and is one of solemnity.

The service is specially designed for Good Friday. It contains appropriate hymns, a sermon and several scripture readings. The church is in candlelight for the Tenebrae service. There are as many candles as there are readings, plus a white candle. As each reading is read a single candle is extinguished until only the white candle (representing the light of Christ) remains. Then the white candle is put out, leaving the congregation in near total darkness— and near total devastation. At this point, the service ends. There is no benediction and the Service ends in silence.

The purpose of the service is to recreate the betrayal, abandonment, and agony of the events and it is left unfinished, because the story isn't over until Easter Day.

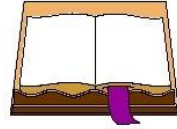
This service has been experienced in our Group of Parishes on Good Friday for ten consecutive years and has been very well received.

Following the usual schedule of rotation between our two Churches it will take place this year in **Magherahamlet**. However, it is, as always, very much a Group occasion for the parishioners of both Annahilt and Magherahamlet. Let us bring our Holy Week observances to a worthy climax this year with a full attendance on Good Friday evening. Of course, we will be observing 'safe distancing' in our seating arrangements. If necessary there will be additional seating in the Parochial Hall.

Hello Everyone

We are now in the month of March, a time when we can really look forward to the beginning of Spring. We will have more days of warmer weather and an opportunity to be outside for a longer period of time to fill our lungs with fresh air and to experience the joy of seeing the Spring bulbs peeping through the soil and coming into bloom. We can be optimistic about the current fall in the number of Covid cases, the ongoing roll out of the vaccination programme and the opportunity for the children to return to school. We pray that these improvements can be sustained.

March is certainly a month of hope and promise but it also includes a special day for members of the Mothers' Union across the world. In 1897 the Mothers' Union formally adopted 25 March as its annual day of prayer, intercession and thanksgiving. It is a day when members remember the Annunciation of the Angel Gabriel to Mary and Mary's faithful response as recorded in the Gospel according to Saint Luke Chapter 1; verses 26-38. Usually plans would already have been made for a Diocesan Festival Service to take place but as this is not now possible, you might like to read the following as part of your prayers and reflection on 25 March. It is an extract from a service prepared by Mary Sumner House in 2020.

In her initial response to the Lord's call upon her life, Mary declared her hope and confidence in the word of God.

The angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid, Mary, you have found favour with God. ³¹You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. ³²He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, ³³and he will reign over Jacob's descendants for ever; his kingdom will never end.'

³⁴ 'How will this be,' Mary asked the angel, 'since I am a virgin?''³⁵The angel answered, 'The Holy Spirit will come on you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God.

36 Even Elizabeth your relative is going to have a child in her old age, and she who was said to be unable to conceive is in her sixth month.

37 For no word from God will ever fail.'

38 'I am the Lord's servant,' Mary answered. 'May your word to me be fulfilled.'
Luke 1:30-38

The truth of Mary's hope and confidence in the word of God was evident to those who had also encountered the Lord's divine intervention in their life.

At that time Mary got ready and hurried to a town in the hill country of Judea, ⁴⁰where she entered Zechariah's home and greeted Elizabeth. ⁴¹When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. ⁴²In a loud voice she exclaimed: 'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the child you will bear! ⁴³But why am I so favoured, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? ⁴⁴As soon as the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy.

45 Blessed is she who has believed that the Lord would fulfil his promises to her!' ⁴⁶And Mary said: 'My soul glorifies the Lord **47** and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour. *Luke 1:39-47*

At the time of Mary's greatest sorrow her hope and confidence in all God had spoken to her through the years kept her faithful to her dying son on the cross and she was blessed once more by the word of the Lord.

25 Near the cross of Jesus stood his mother, his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene.

26 When Jesus saw his mother there, and the disciple whom he loved standing near by, he said to her, 'Woman, here is your son,'

27 and to the disciple, 'Here is your mother.'

From that time on, this disciple took her into his home. *John 19:25-27*

As the wonders of Pentecost approached Mary was to be found still following the word of her Lord as she joined in prayer and waited for the gift of the Spirit.

Jesus gave them this command: 'Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. For John baptised with water, but in a few days you will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

They all joined together constantly in prayer, along with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brothers.

Acts 1:4-5, 14

May Christ the Son of God, born of Mary, fill you with hope and confidence to trust his promises and follow his will.

For most of the last twelve months there has been a lot of emphasis on activities that we cannot now do in everyday life and a lot of thought has been put into working out what it is that we can do, safely. For many of us, especially myself (Esme) this apparent state of limbo causes confusion and means that I end up doing nothing at all because by the time that I have agonised over it the opportunity has passed. This is certainly not so in the case of two ladies from our parish. When they read last month's Parish Magazine and found out that the Action and Outreach Branch of Mother's Union were requesting items of baby clothing for the very tiny babies born in the Neo Natal Units of Belfast and Craigavon Hospitals they immediately accelerated their knitting and crochet activities and between them were able to donate an amazing number of items- that is 45 cardigans, 45 baby hats and 27 small quilts. On behalf of everyone, we would like to say a very sincere and huge 'Thank You' for all your hard work and generosity. We can guarantee that each tiny baby item will be very gratefully received and appreciated.



Inspired by both of these ladies, I have decided to put aside my indecision and spend half an hour, twice a week, praying and doing something positive to help someone else. Sometimes it is not the doing of something that is the hardest part but it is the 'getting started.'

May God encourage us to be his helping hands on earth and make it easier for us to say to ourselves, "Come on now, Ready, Steady, Go"

Grant for Equipment

Annahilt Parish recently were awarded another small grant from The Dept. for Communities Voluntary, Community and Social Economy Fund and this has enabled us to buy a "Fogging" machine to sanitise our church and hall properties when necessary/between services or events, additional hand sanitising stations and additional necessary PPE and consumables.

Organ Repairs

For some time the Annahilt Select Vestry have been very aware that some restoration and repair was necessary to preserve our 1895 historic 2 manual Connacher organ for future generations. Following a detailed report and quote from Wells-Kennedy Partnership, Organ Builders and Consultants, it was unanimously agreed to proceed with the works. Our treasurer subsequently made application to The Pilgrim Trust and after various communications we have been awarded a grant of almost £15K to cover the cost of the project excluding VAT. This will be received on completion of the work. We hope to be able to reclaim the VAT element from another funder in due course. Wells-Kennedy commenced the work in mid-January and it will take several weeks to complete.

Recording of Services

For the past year most of us have been able to benefit from the audio recordings of our Sunday and other special occasion Services either online via the website or from a CD recording.

During the present government ordered restrictions it is not possible to leave items for the Foodbank at Church. However, if parishioners would like to continue to donate at this time, and it is hoped that many will, they may wish to know that the collection points at the two supermarkets, Tesco and Sainsbury's, are permanent points and will allow people to continue to remember those who rely on the Foodbank in a very practical way.

A particular request from the Foodbank is for items listed below:

Easter eggs/chocolate

Coffee

Diluted juice

Sugar
