The Rector writes....

My dear Parishioners

It is hard to believe this is our fourth magazine since 'the lockdown' began. After 16 weeks there is now a significant 'opening up' although the crisis is certainly not over. I hope everyone is keeping well and positive in these challenging

days. One person described 'the lockdown' very powerfully when she said that while we are all in the same boat, we have very different cabins.

I'm conscious that for some, 'the lockdown' has been a very positive experience when they have had the opportunity to get many jobs and projects completed, which they wouldn't normally have had time for. They have had the chance to spend more time with their immediate family and it has brought people closer together. For others it has been a much more challenging experience. There are some who have been unwell and had to self-isolate and look after themselves when they have felt absolutely awful. Many with underlying medical conditions have had to cocoon at home for the past 3 months and feel the sense of isolation acutely. While some were very content in their own company, others would have loved to have regular interaction with others and desperately missed that human contact. Some too have been in very uncertain positions regarding their income and employment and this has caused enormous stress and anxiety as people now try to return to a 'new normal'. I wonder what you are enjoying the most now that we are at last permitted to go about again. Maybe it's the freedom to go and see some of the people you love the most in the world, to share a meal or a cup of tea or coffee with them and give them a big hug. Maybe it is getting back to a sport you play.

The one question many people have been asking me is, when are we going to be able to return to attending Services in our beautiful church buildings? Unfortunately, it's a question I cannot answer at this point even though the Stormont Executive has approved a return to in Church worship. I can inform you that we recently received a document from the Diocesan Authorities encouraging us to think about all the restrictions and conditions that we have to comply with whenever we open our doors again. The document stressed it was at an **undetermined** date. Putting in place all these measures is going to be quite a process. We will be considering the document carefully at Select Vestry level. However, we will not be opening the doors before we believe it is safe to do so and we have done all in our power to comply with the guidance and ensure everyone's safety as far as is humanly possible.

This is quite a responsibility and we would ask for your prayers and your patience as

we do all that we can to achieve that. It will involve discipline and co-operation on all our parts as we observe social distancing. Our numbers will probably be initially restricted as we adhere to the 2 metre rule. However, I understand that families can sit together when we are permitted to assemble again. We won't be allowed to have prayer books or hymn books and we will have to wipe down hard surfaces between services. It appears that we will not be allowed to sing initially and that we will be encouraged to wear face masks. It is not easy to make plans with a definite timeline only gradually emerging and I understand if people are feeling impatient with this. We will be continuing for the foreseeable future to provide online services and to make it possible for those without internet access to be able to hear a recording of the Sunday service by CD.

During this summer season I am normally wishing those who might be going away a pleasant holiday, safe travelling and encouraging them to support the local congregation wherever they happen to go. It's a good opportunity to experience worship that may be different to our own and to enjoy that experience. While I suspect many of us won't be straying too far this summer, everyone certainly has plenty of choice when it comes to online services. I know many have been taking the opportunity to tune into services from different places on a Sunday over recent months and that's a great thing to do. At this juncture we will continue to distribute the Parish Magazine by post to ensure that it is received by all parishioners, especially those without internet access. We want to reassure every person of our ongoing prayers in these days.

As the restrictions begin to lift I am very happy to come and pray with those who might like a conversation either in the garden or indoors if they are comfortable with that and provided no members of the household are shielding or showing signs of feeling unwell, especially with possible symptoms of COVID-19.

In a time of continuing uncertainty when we don't yet have definite answers to many people's questions about the reopening of church, we are reminded that while the doors are closed, the church is very much open for business. We want to encourage people on their faith journey using resources on our website, through the experience of public worship recorded weekly and sharing devotional resources in this magazine. We are very grateful to people for phoning regularly and providing pastoral support to each other and praying for one another. It's lovely to hear how faithfully people have been doing this and how much it means to people. We will endeavour to communicate with people as soon as we know more about when it is safe and permissible to gather together again.

Please pray for the Bishop and others who are trying to make important decisions based on Government advice. The weight of responsibility upon those in positions of

responsibility is very great at this time.

Many people in the coming months will be preparing to move on to a new stage in their education, maybe moving to second level or third level. Our thoughts and prayers are with you as you prepare for that transition. We're conscious too that many may be nervous about returning to church initially as they are asked to continue 'shielding' by their doctor because of underlying medical conditions. Please do comply with the guidance you have been given and be assured that services will continue to be available online for the foreseeable future. We would not wish you to feel anxious or unsafe when we do return. Most unfortunately, some restrictions have had to be imposed in some areas of the United Kingdom again soon after relaxing them. Hence we will be moving forward with caution.

In all of the present anxiety and uncertainty we are glad to place our hope in the one who has promised to be our anchor in the storm, Jesus of Nazareth, and we look to Him for steadiness and reassurance and we continue in our mission to make Him known and share His love with others.

On a personal note may I take this opportunity on behalf of my siblings Rosemary Mark & Mandy, and on my own behalf of expressing a deep and heartfelt 'thank you' to everyone in the Group of Parishes for all your kindness and consideration to us following the recent death of our dear mother.

We have been absolutely overwhelmed by the volume of cards, letters, emails, telephone and other messages which we have received from parishioners and friends paying tribute to Mum and expressing your sympathy in our great loss. These have been an immense comfort to us and we are deeply grateful.

It is some five years since my mother and father came to live in these parts when their health declined. They genuinely settled here and felt very much at home. For as long as they were able, they were very happy participating in the worship and other activities in both parishes. The last time my mother was in Church was on Ash Wednesday evening, determined to be present when our new Bishop was making his first visit.

My mother was especially appreciative, as indeed I was, of the friendliness and support shown to her by so many in Annahilt & Magherahamlet in the three and a half years following my father's death in 2016. She was also very aware & grateful for the thoughts and prayers of you all especially over recent months during her periods of illness.

Unfortunately, on account of the particular circumstances of the present time the Funeral was private. In due course it is hoped to have a Service of Remembrance and Thanksgiving to which all will be welcome.

In the meantime, may I renew my most grateful thanks to you all. You have truly reached out to me and my family, something I will remember and appreciate as long as my memory lasts.



Peter Lynas

Peter Lynas became UK Director in December 2019 following eight years as NI Director.

Originally trained as a lawyer, Peter worked as a barrister in Belfast for five years, before studying theology at Regent

College in Vancouver where he remains a board member. He has previously worked for the Relationships Foundation pursuing a biblically inspired vision for a better society and taught on faith at work and ethics at Belfast Bible College. Peter has also worked as executive pastor for his church, Causeway Coast Vineyard, and with the Lynas Foodservice business.

During his time as NI director Peter has become a significant media commentator in Northern Ireland, bringing insight on legal, cultural and political issues. Peter was a leading commentator throughout the Ashers bakery court case, and he is a familiar figure at the Northern Ireland Assembly at Stormont.

In his current role, Peter continues to speak on behalf of the Evangelical Alliance and passionately advocate for the place and value of faith in public life.

Magherahamlet Parochial Hall Cleaning
